**ZULUS TORTURED
BRITISH SOLDIERS**

LONDON Sept. 28.—Mr. Henry Tully who has been nearly thirty years in South Africa, writes from Pietermaritzburg to his brother, Captain R. Tully, of South Shields, defending the troops operating in Natal against the charges of barbarity brought by Mr. Keir Hardie and some other M.P.s.

He states that the very opposite was the case. The women and children were well taken care of, and only the natives who were found in arms against us were killed.

With regard to the other side of the picture, the writer says: "Brooks and Brown, of my old corps, the Natal Mounted Police, were most terribly mutilated. In the case of Neal, a non-combatant, he must have suffered awful torture. A native witness has confessed to us that the poor fellow was held down while the soles of his feet were cut off."

**ANY HUNTER
IN CANAAN WOODS**

Edmonton, Alberta, Sept. 27.—The Rev. J. D. Whittaker, a missionary, has arrived here after spending the winter at Herschel Island where the American whalers were frozen in for the winter. Mr. Whittaker left the northern island during March, and although the whalers will not be able to get out until August, he says they have sufficient food to carry them through. He laughs at the idea that they are dying of scurvy and starvation, as they were all in the best of health when he left. These whalers will put in some six weeks hunting before returning south after the waters have opened up and hope to have good catches although whales were any thing but plentiful up there last summer. Mr. Whittaker came down by the MacKenzie River, taking nearly five months on the trip owing to several places he had to visit. Game of all kinds is plentiful in the far north this summer, he states, and he expects the far catch during the coming winter will be a record on both in the quantity and quality of the furs.
