TO ENGAGE IN SLUGGING FEAST FOR RIGHT OF FIGHTING ROY

MONTREAL, May 12.—Ted Cossette, of Montreal, and "Red" MacDonald, of Halifax, fought 10 rounds to a draw in the feature bout of the Canadian lightweight elimination tournament held here tonight to decide an opponent for Leo Kid Roy, the titleholder. These other 10 round bouts were held and tonight's winners will meet later in the month in the second stage. The Cossette-MacDonald match was a slugging feast. The two boxers battled toe to toe throughout. Cossette had the better of the fighting in the early stages, but MacDonald rallied in the fifth round and from then on was the aggressor and landed the more telling blows. At the conclusion of the tenth the decision was given as a draw and was received with disapproval by the crowd, who expressed the opinion that the Halifax man had won.

STELLARTON, May 12.—Hundreds crowded the town hall tonight to hear President Sammy Doyle of the M. P. B. explain his position in the present mixup. A resolution was drafted by a committee after the meeting in which President McVicar is asked to reinstate the men who are the bone of contention in the present mixup, if as he says, President Doyle has no power to reinstate. The meeting was in favor of getting the reinstated men back and suggested that unless President McVicar reinstates the men in question that Nova Scotia withdraw from the C. A. A. U. and form a separate association.
