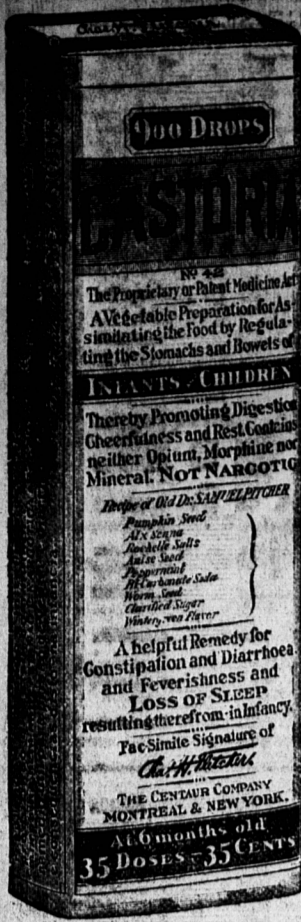
THE STORY
