Sunday School Lesson

For this Sunday so near Christmas we have the choice of a Christmas lesson, or that in the regular series. The feeding of the multitudes (Matt. xiv. 1-23), of which the Golden Text is, "They have no need to go away: give ye them to eat." "Give ye them to eat," said Jesus to His disciples, pointing to the vast crowd before them. And the disciples were staggered by the command. It would take at least 240 worth of bread, they protested to feed that host. "How many loaves have ye?" "Five, and two fishes." And without sending to Bethsaida for bread, He bids them feed the crowd on the scanty provisions they had. Five loaves and two fishes, and a crowd of 5,000 men to be fed. It looked absurd, did it not? But, after Christ had blessed them, those loaves and fishes multiplied in the giving, so that all had enough and there were twelve baskets full of the fragments left over; 5,000 men fed on those loaves and fishes, and more was left at the end than there was at the beginning.

THE BIRTH OF JESUS.

(Luke 2:8-20) (Sunday, December 19.)

Golden Text.—There is born to you this day, in the city of David a Saviour, who is Christ the Lord. —Luke 2:11.

The angel is the first evangelist. He soothes the shepherd's fear by the word which is ever the first that Heaven's messengers need to speak to sinful men, and then passes with that "Behold," which signifies His message as marvelous and weighty, to tell first, in general terms, the joyful news of His birth, and then to unfold in few words the very heart of the gospel. Mark how steadily His words climb upwards, as if from the cradle to the throne. He begins with the lowly birth, and then rises, step by step, each word opening a wider and more wonderful prospect, to that climax beyond which there is nothing—that this infant is "the Lord." The full joy and tremendous wonder of the first word are not felt till we read the last. The birth is the birth of the Lord. We cannot give any but the highest meaning to that sacred name, which could have but one meaning to a Jew. It was much that there was born a Saviour. Men need a deliverer, and the proclamation here is best kept in its widest meaning—as of one who sets free from all his outward and inward wrong. The Saviour of men must be a man, and therefore it is good news that He is born. It was much that Messiah should be born. The fulfillment of the wistful prophecy of the Divine communication of the Spirit of old for their work, the succession to David's throne, were all declared in that one announcement that the Christ was born in David's city. But that last word, "the Lord," crowns the wonder and the blessing, while it lays the only possible foundation for the other two names.

If, on the one hand, man's Saviour must be man, on the other he must be more than man; and nothing short of a Divine man can heal the wounds of mankind, or open a fountain of blessing sufficient for their needs. Unless God became man, there can be no Saviour nor can there be any Christ; for no mere humanity can bear the full gift of the Divine Spirit, which as Messiah's anointing for His office nor discharge that office in all its depths and breadth. Many in this day try to repeat the angel's message, and leave out the last word, and then they wonder that it stirs little gladness and works no salvation. Let us be sure that, unless the birth at Bethlehem was the incarnation of Deity, it would have called forth no angel songs, nor will it work any deliverance, nor bring any joy to men—Dr. MacLaren's Bible Class Expositions.

Carpentier Signed To Meet Moran

LONDON, Dec. 15.—Georges Carpentier, European heavyweight champion, and Frank Moran, the American, who finished Joe Beckett in two rounds, have practically been signed for a twenty round bout here in February, it became known today. The agreement already has been signed, only a few details over price remaining to be settled, according to Francois Deschamps, the Frenchman's manager. "Sure we're willing to meet Moran. He is so slow he will be easy for Carpentier. There is nothing in the Dempsey-Carpentier agreement to prevent the bout, as the articles merely prevent Carpentier from boxing in America and Dempsey from appearing in Europe before the fight," he said.
