WASHINGTON, October 11.-A cablegram received yesterday from Commissioner General Peck at Paris, contains an announcement of the final results obtained by the various countries in the form of awards at Paris Exposition. The United States received 2,475 awards; Germany 1,876; Great Britain 1,727, and Russia 1,449. The United States leads not only in the grand total, but also in all grades of awards from grand prizes to mere honorable mention.
