## Morning Stock Letter

NEW YORK, Sept. 17—The most unsettling news this morning is concerning strikes at the silk works at Lyons, France. Important members of French Cabinet are meeting today to plan calming measures. The Spanish news is no better and it is probably foreign news that caused unsettlement of the market in the past few days. Pullman declared a regular dividend yesterday. Dividend meetings today are National Sugar, Pan American Fisheries. If it were not for the fact that yesterday was the fifth successive day of decline, we would rather expect more selling today and this will probably come this morning. But it would seem from a timing standpoint that a rally even of minor proportions is about due. As pointed out in yesterday's letter the corner stocks resisted selling yesterday and we especially watch Anaconda as one stock in which profitable turn might be made.

### EXTRACTS FROM THE NORTH-ERN MINER

TORONTO, Sept. 17—Little Long Lac—May be placed on a 400 ton basis within near future. Current setting 250 tons daily. Increase in ore reserves on fifth level. August gross production estimated at \$127,000 against \$115,000 during July.

Hardrock—Surface sampling towards west part of property indicates several important shoots of high grade ore. The new number two shaft has revealed \$11.37 grade.

## MINING

(Canadian Press) TORONTO, Sept. 17—The Toronto mining share market skidded downward today in moderate selling, particularly in the medium-price golds. The yellow metal group dropped 1.19 to 142.21 and the Miscellaneous Mines group 2.34 to 145.84. Volume tapered off to little better than 1,000,000 shares.

European war talk apparently influenced traders and while offerings were not burdensome there was a noticeable thinning of the buying demand. A few golds, Red Lake Gold Shore, Hard Rock and Kirkland-Hudson Bay declined 14 to 25 cents each in sizeable volume and other issues of the medium-price group taking losses of 5 to 10 cents were Argosy, Buffalo-Ankerite, Canadian Malartic, Macassa, McWatters, New Golden Rose, Pamour, Airways, San Antonio, Shawkey and Sullivan.

Interest was not very perceptible in the big golds, although Lake Shore registered a half-point gain and Bralorne was taken in quantity at a gain of 20. Pioneer firmed 5 to 7.60. Moving a little higher also appeared Francoeur, Pickle Crow, Sladen and Little Long Lac. Bidgood-Kirkland dropped 13 cents and Anglo-Huronian 25.

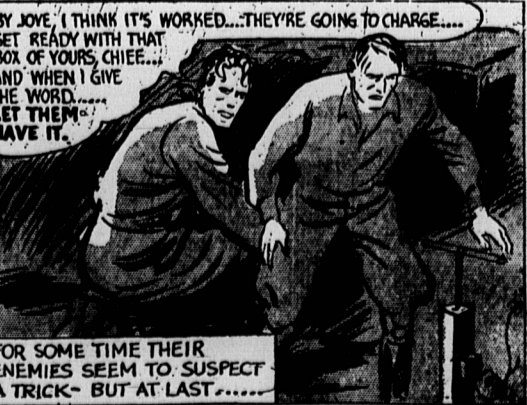
