At the Police Court yesterday morning Frank McKenna who was summoned for third offence against the Prohibitory Law confessed and threw himself on the clemency of the Court stating he had a small family, was in poor health, had stopped selling liquor a week before he got the summons, and if given another chance would keep out of the liquor business for ever. The Magistrate stated that although the victory in driving a man out of the liquor traffic might in the moral sense be a great one still as a police magistrate he had no power to waive the penalty of the law. After the previous convictions had been proven the defendant was sentenced to six months imprisonment. The adjourned case against Charles Collins jr was dismissed. The evidence was absolutely contradictory and the magistrate said, in the case he would give the benefit of the doubt to the defendant. Mr Weeks, counsel for the youthful defendant reproached Inspector Jenkins for bringing a case against a mere boy and the Inspector in reply stated that he had repeatedly warned the boy's aunt, his father now being in jail for third offence, and later had even spoken to the boy himself, but had received only impertinence in return. He had received repeated complaints for selling even on Sunday against this house, which is situated on Gratton Street in the rear of John Lin's laundry and he had no course but to take the present action.
