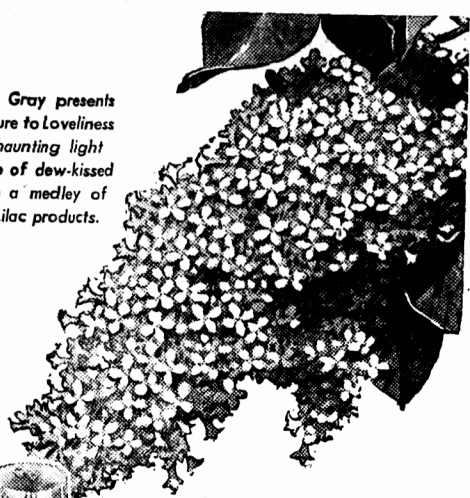

(Continued from Page 2) and he said: "And we never got one pine cone yet! I would slip away along a snowy trail then and gather cones for Jamie. If snow lay evenly, but not very deep, over meadows and hill sides, there would I decide, not be any depth of it in the woods. For the neighboring trees grow thickly there, where this pine of mine stands on the banks of a stream, that flows down to swell the waters of the river below. James was carrying hay to some young stock in a box stall at the rear of a barn, at the time, commencing the evening feeding. He stopped a minute forkful on shoulder. "To the woods?" he echoed my words "at this hour of the day! Its dusky there now. You'll get lost, Ellen!" After long years of trying to earn a good opinion from him in this regard, he still does not get much store on my sense of direction. At the very last, he may give in and say: "Never mind her, Lord—she'll find her way!" But yesterday, he repeated "yes, you'll get lost, Ellen" with an air of finality.

Pard, our white hound, listening to our conversation, gave an ecstatic yelp—in the unforlunable ways of knowing that dogs have—and led away along the fields. We had only a short distance to go merely across a line fence and then winding through dim fragrant aisles of second growth spruce to reach our goal. We were presently in a land of our own—Pard and I, where nothing else moved and the only sound came from our steps and the rush of the stream in the valley below. True, he startled odd rabbits, that led him merry chases, and sometimes as we parted branches, squirrels called down to ask us curiously for our credentials. Silent and miraculously fashioned and dim and lovely that woodland was. To enter it was like going into a great church or cathedral where "the peace that passeth understanding" is to be found at the foot of the tree. These trees their heads over wide spaces, and a sprinkling of snow concealed their whereabouts. However, we found and gathered a number, all tightly wound in the frost. We had perhaps loitered there too long. For it was dusky now indeed, when we began to retrace our steps. So I hurried, parting branches that barred the path or stooping to follow Pard through dark and dense undergrowth. But always towards the West, where the sky when we caught sight of it, was lit into a rose glow. Then we heard, not too far away: "El-len, where are you? El-len!" "I'm here" I called "just over here." And Pard yelped his reply: it was James, not that we needed his guiding but there he was, when we came to the line-grumbling a bit, but concerned-bless his heart!

Today Saturday returned in an early blaze of loveliness above the same woodlands, which as the day wore on, became covered by sullen low hanging clouds. There was work in the wood-lot at the other farm, where they bustled themselves, as Jock said "trimming up the fallen stuff" to make fuel wood. Meanwhile in farm houses preparations for the Christmas season goes on. You catch it in the news of a baked fruit cake; in curtains freshly laundered; in floors newly polished. It comes too in Jamie's "jingle bells" with only a sign of melody there; in a Radio carol and I believe in folks' hearts, in this month of all, which brings the season of "good will toward men."
