## DEATH CAME TO HIM SUDDENLY

And Without the Warning of a Moment.

Lemuel Phillips, a Prominent Citizen of Charlottetown Drops Dead Yesterday Morning.

Many citizens were shocked yesterday morning to learn of the sudden death of one of Charlottetown's well-known residents which occurred without a moment's warning at ten o'clock in the show-rooms of The Mark Wright Furnishing Company.

The one whose life was so suddenly taken away, without the warning of a moment was Lemuel Phillips of Hillsboro Street and formerly a member of Chappell and Phillips, architects of this city. Mr. Phillips had come from his home to attend a meeting of the St. Peter's Star Company of which he was the manager. The meeting was to be held at ten o'clock in the office of E. H. Beer which is situated to the rear of the show-rooms of the furniture firm. L. L. Beer had already arrived and as the clock was striking ten Mr. Phillips entered the store. He walked to the back of the building, shook the snow off his feet and proceeded towards the stairway which leads to Mr. Beer's office. E. H. Beer and Mark Wright were coming down the steps, the latter to meet him.

When about six feet from the foot of the stairway Mr. Phillips spoke.

"Good morning, Mr. Beer," he said, "it is a stormy—"

Suddenly and before the sentence was concluded, Mr. Phillips stiffened and fell to the floor as a log, his head striking with considerable force. Before the on-lookers could reach him and perhaps even before the body reached the floor it was lifeless.

Dr. Carruthers and Coroner H. D. Johnson were immediately summoned by telephone, restoratives were procured at Rankin's adjoining drug store, but nothing could be done, the vital spark had fled and earthy aid was powerless to recall it. The physicians after examining the body pronounced the death due to a rupture of a blood vessel of the brain causing hemorrhage and consequent instant death. If death had not been instantaneous, even before the body had fallen, it would have been hastened by the striking of the head on the floor. Mr. Phillips had made no complaint of feeling unwell and the night before had been in the best of health. He had apparently not the slightest premonition of the summons he was shortly to receive.

The late Mr. Phillips was born in Montague 65 years ago. When about twenty five he removed to Charlottetown and has resided in this city ever since. He began his apprenticeship as a carpenter under the late Thomas Alley, father of the late Judge Alley. Later he started a contracting and building business with the late John Lewis, under the firm name of Phillips & Lewis. This firm was dissolved in 1880.

After the big fire which destroyed what is now Victoria Row in 1883 the deceased entered a partnership with C. B. Chappell and remained with him in the architectural business for ten years. Since 1893 he has been engaged in the starch business and as a manager of several lobster factories.

There are left to mourn three children; George residing in the Northwest; Hortense at home and Wendell in the employ of L. W. Cook, jeweler. The deceased

wife who was a sister of Simon W. Crabbe's predeceased him a number of years ago.  
The late gentleman was highly respected by all to whom he was known. He was a quiet, inoffensive Christian gentleman universally esteemed. For a number of years he was a trustee of the First Methodist Church and always took a deep interest in its welfare. The members of that congregation as well as all his acquaintances will join with The Guardian in extending sincere sympathy to the bereaved.

## THE EDITOR'S MAIL.

### FRUIT GROWERS.

Sir,—The announcements are now out for the meeting of the Provincial Fruit Growers' Association. This Association with its pre-entious name has been in existence a good many years. Its annual meetings have been generously treated by The Guardian and others of the local press. The time has now come when it is proper to inquire, what it has actually accomplished in producing fruit.

This question was forced on your correspondent by some statements made to him by a barrel manufacturer from a neighboring province, who said that for several years past he had contemplated establishing a branch of his business in this Province for making fruit barrels in very large numbers. But of late, he remarked, there is no encouragement for such a project. The want of encouragement was not, he said, in the natural adaptability of the country to grow fruit, which he considered to be very good, but the trouble was with the men who attempted to produce it. While in successful fruit growing and exporting districts orchardists got their supplies of young trees from the nurseries in lots of thousands at a time, here the planter feels he has overstepped the bounds of prudence if he asks the nursery man for more than one or two dozen, the result being that the day is very distant before this can be an exporting country requiring hundreds of thousands of fruit barrels annually.

Your correspondent was not sufficiently well informed to object to the barrel man's assertions. At any rate, as he was interested in his trade, it is likely he had got safe information. It is certain that as yet a factory of the stated dimensions is not called for by our growers. And a more serious consideration is that it can never pay the owner of a small plantation to neglect the larger demands of his big fields of grains, vegetables, hay, etc. while attending to the numerous requirements of a small fruit plot.
