fatal to win with the ace, because East would then have the club suit stopped and declarer would never make more than three club tricks.

Thus the problem was whether to let West hold the trick with his king, or to go up with the ace, test the clubs further, and then if it was discovered that they did not break, to rely on the diamond finesse. The trouble with letting West hold the king was obviously that he might then be able to lay down two more heart tricks, to defeat the contract on the spot.

To solve this difficulty South harked back to the bidding. Surely, he told himself, if West had held a five-card heart suit headed by the K-Q-J and probably the ten as well, he would have made the non-vulnerable overall of one heart. Thus, his failure to make this overall argued strongly that he had held only a four card suit.

Acting on this shrewd premise, declarer gave West the club king and since West could then cash only one more heart trick, the contract was safe.
