FREDERICTON, March 25--(Special)--Robert A. Payne one of the best known journalists in New Brunswick died at the old family homestead at Lincoln on Saturday night very suddenly aged sixty two.

RUSSIAN GOVERNMENT FIRM AS ADAMANT

Will Continue in its Course--No Danger Apprehended From Uprising--Situation Altered Since Last Fall--Troops from Manchuria Said to be Loyal--Reactionaries are Powerful--Doubtful if Czar Can Succeed with His Program.

ST. PETERSBURG, March 25--(Special)--The Government is now confident that no danger exists from any armed uprising or revolution.

The situation is completely altered since last fall. The army is reorganized and the troops returned from Manchuria are unquestionably loyal.

In his desire to follow the wishes of the people and grant reforms, grave doubts are increasing as to his power to make headway against country revolution which threatens to sweep away the entire programme on which the government has entered.

RECORD SHIPLOAD OF IMMIGRANTS

March 24--The coroner's jury in the case of Percy Norman, 13 years old, charged with killing his father while the latter was abusing and beating his wife last Sunday, concluded their inquest and returned a verdict that "Edward Norman came to his death by a blow from an axe in the hands of his son Percy, which was inflicted in defence of his mother. We bring in a verdict of justifiable homicide."
