THE FIRST CONVICTION.

The first conviction under the new prohibitory law was made before the Stipendiary Magistrate on Saturday last, the convicted party being H. C. Connolly, whose place of business is on Grafton Street.

No provision is made in the prohibitory law for an appeal from the Magistrate's decision, and therefore the ordinary right to appeal does not exist. There are none the less two or three ways in which it is claimed that the validity of the conviction and of the law itself may be tested.

If the matter were thus brought before the Supreme Court by writ of certiorari the Court might then hear argument as to the constitutionality of the law, and in case it should be held that the law exceeds the enabling power of the Legislature it would then follow that the Magistrate had no jurisdiction and the conviction would be quashed.

A third means of testing the validity of the law would be for a person convicted, fined, and imprisoned to bring an action claiming damages for false imprisonment. Proceedings once set in motion on either of the lines above referred to, (excepting proceedings on habeas corpus) might be carried from Court to Court and to the Privy Council at last.

It is now altogether a question of the validity of the law, and that question must be decided by the Courts. They will doubtless weigh the matter most carefully, alike because of the important interests involved, and because the law deals with a subject in which the jurisdiction of the Legislature is admittedly somewhat limited.

Rev. Dr. Bennet was born in Ireland some eighty five years ago. There he received his very thorough education and was ordained to the work of the Christian ministry. There he married and two children were born before his removal to St. John.

During the period of his active life, Rev. Dr. Bennet held many positions in the gift of his brethren of the ministry, and was a conspicuous figure in the Presbytery and the General Assembly. He wrote and delivered many lectures on literary and religious topics, and was distinctly popular as a lecturer.

Rev. Dr. Bennet was a man of large frame and noteworthy appearance. He was a Christian gentleman of the old school, who won and held the esteem and regard of all with whom he came in contact.

The surviving relatives are Mrs. Bennet, widow of the deceased, formerly Miss Scott; two sons, Frederick G. Bennet, Chief Clerk in the Customs Department, Oitawa, and Ed. J. Bennet of the Hudson's Bay service Winnipeg; five daughters—Mrs. John A. Boak of Chicago, Mrs. W. S. Gardiner of Montreal, Mrs. J. E. B. McCready of Charlottetown, Mrs. W. S. Spear of Fort Fairheld, Maine and Mrs. George Young of St. John.
