When pulley comes into carrier the load or strain is shifted from pulley direct to heavy frame of carrier, which then conveys it along track until tripped at desired point and then returns quickly ready for another jag. 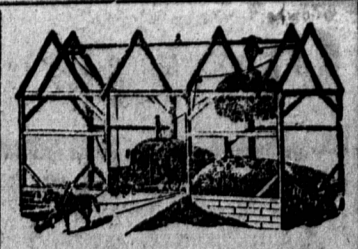
