As Sir George so lucidly pointed out, the Hon. Mr. Cramer occupied a seat in the House of Commons, side by side with Fielding, Lemf

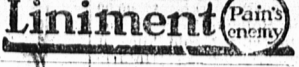

The Michaelmas Term of the Supreme Court opened yesterday. His Lordship Chief Justice Matheson, with Justices Haszard and Arsenault on the Bench. There were five cases for writ of certiorari, set down to be tried later, and seven cases for new trial to stand over. There is now before the court an appeal case of Peter G. Clark appellant, vs F. J. Trainor, respondent. A. C. Saunders for appellant and J. A. McDonald for respondent. Application was made for admission of Reginald Dunbar Williams as a student at law in McLeod and Bentley's office and an order was made for his examination. The Court adjourned in the afternoon to meet this morning at 11 o'clock.
