VENEZUELA AN AFFAIRS.

The affairs of Venezuela are still unsettled and the Republic remains in a most unfortunate position, its coast blockaded by the naval forces of Britain, Germany and Italy while a revolution of rather formidable proportions is going on within. The negotiations for such a settlement as will enable the blockade to be raised have encountered some unexpected obstacles. The allied powers have claimed as a condition of raising the blockade that they shall be guaranteed 30 per cent of the Venezuelan customs revenue to be set aside from year to year until their claims are paid. This is objected to by Venezuela and also by the United States Government, as well as by the other powers having claims against Venezuela.

France, the Netherlands, Mexico and some other countries have claims against Venezuela and profess themselves unwilling to wait till Britain, Germany and Italy are first paid, for it would probably take six or more years for the stipulated 30 per cent of the customs revenues to extinguish their claims. Minister Bowen on behalf of Venezuela proposed that all the nations having claims should share alike in proportion to amount in the distribution of the 30 per cent of the customs revenue, the true value of their claims to be determined by The Hague Tribunal. The allied powers are willing to have their claims thus adjudicated at The Hague but peremptorily refuse to share with other powers in the distribution of the money. They claim, with apparent justice that having gone to large expense to enforce payment of their claims, it would not be fair for other nations to be placed on equal terms with regard to payment.

Minister Bowen, on behalf of Venezuela, has put forward the proposal that the question of equality between the claimant nations shall also be submitted to The Hague tribunal. This matter is still undetermined and appears to be the sticking point in the negotiations. Minister Bowen on the part of Venezuela has refused to agree to the proposal of the allied powers that they shall first be paid without regard to the other claimants. He has also objected on the part of the Washington Government to the prolongation of an alliance for a term of years in the future against one of the South American republics on the ground that it would create conditions which would endanger the friendly relations between the United States and several European powers. A compromise has been proposed under which the allied powers would be given a preference for some months during which they should take 30 per cent of the Venezuelan customs, after which limited period all the claimants should stand on an equality. This proposal has not at this writing been accepted.

While it is still probable that a peaceful settlement will be effected in the end, it will be seen that the effect of the negotiations so far has been rather to raise new issues and broaden the scope of the controversy than to make any substantial advance toward a solution of the trouble. It is a very complicated and delicate matter, in fact, which all the nations concerned no doubt earnestly desire to get off their hands as speedily as possible. The feeling grows that Minister Bowen and the Washington authorities are disposed to hinder rather than help to a solution. Their sympathies are wholly with Venezuela, and in the effort to shelter their proteges in the most effectual way dilatory tactics are being resorted to such as are common enough in the law courts when a dishonest debtor is trying to stave off the payment of a just debt, but which are beneath the dignity and unbecoming to the conduct of international negotiations.

It will be remembered that in December 1901, when Miss Blair was drowned in the Ottawa River, Henry Albert Harper lost his life in the effort to save her. It was eminently fitting that this act of heroic self-sacrifice should be recognized in some public way and the citizens of Ottawa with others have subscribed about \$3,000 for the erection of a monument to Mr. Harper's memory. The monument is to be of stone or bronze and is to take the form of a figure symbolical of heroism and nobility of character, such for example as is suggested by the figure of Sir Galahad in the painting of that name by Sir Frederick Watts, R. A. A circular letter is now being sent out to Canadian and American sculptors inviting designs and estimate for the work.

When the Dominion of Canada was formed the salary of the Governor General was fixed at \$50,000. At that time the salary of the President of the United States was but \$25,000. It was afterwards increased to \$50,000 and so remains. It is now proposed to again double the salary of the President, so as to give him \$100,000 a year. This will still be a modest salary for the executive head of a nation of seventy-five millions of people. The President of France receives 600,000 francs (\$120,000) salary and a like sum for expenses, and France has but half as much population as the United States. The Viceroy of India is paid \$300,000. It would seem that the salary of the President of the States ought to be increased for obvious reasons, to maintain a fitting state and dignity, but to base the proposed addition on the increased cost of living as has been done is to make a pretext for increasing the pay of all the salaried persons in America.
