\*IMPORTANT DECISION RE HIGHWAY TRAFFIC ACT—A decision which should serve as a warning to all motorists came out of a case arising out of a collision of an auto truck with a horse and carriage on the highway near New Annan on the evening of October 4th last and which came up for hearing on Friday before Mr. Geo. M. Mathews, Stipendiary Magistrate for Prince County.

The charge was laid under Section 35, (1) which reads: "Every person driving or operating a motor vehicle on a highway shall drive and operate the same in a careful manner having regard to all the circumstances, including but without restricting the generality of the foregoing, the nature, condition and use of the highway and the traffic which at the time is or might reasonably be expected to be on the highway, and no person shall drive or operate a motor vehicle on a highway so as to endanger or be likely to endanger the life or limb of any person or the safety of any property."

The evidence was to the effect that the truck ran into the carriage from behind demolishing it and severely injuring the horse; the occupants of the carriage fortunately escaped with minor injuries. The defendant contended that a car coming in the opposite direction with very bright head lights so dazzled his vision that he did not see the carriage until it was too late to avoid the collision.

The Magistrate in making a conviction held that the fact that the driver of the truck was blinded by the lights of the approaching car did not exonerate him, but only called for a greater degree of care and that he should have slowed down his truck so as to be able to meet any emergency which might arise in such circumstances.—S

GERMAN "INNER CIRCLE" HOLDS CONFERENCE

Greatest Crisis in History of Disarmament Faces German Government.

BERLIN, Oct. 13.—(A.P.)—The German Cabinet remained in session all day today and far into the night as the Hitler Government faced what was considered the greatest crisis in the history of disarmament.

While the Cabinet met in intimate session with only the Chancellor and the inner circle of ministers present at a so-called "chiefs' meeting," American Ambassador William E. Dodd began a long-deferred conference with Foreign Minister Von Neurath regarding Nazi plans on Americans.

Ambassador Dodd said "the matter is in the process of a solution which I think will be satisfactory," but declined to discuss any other developments.

No communique was issued after the Cabinet session, but instructions issued to Dr. Rudolf Nadelny, German delegate to the Geneva Disarmament Conference, are most likely to insist that the powers recognize Germany's equality claims as emphatically and repeatedly set forth on behalf of the Hitler Government.

It was semi-officially announced that Dr. Nadelny will remain in Berlin probably until Monday instead of returning to Geneva tomorrow as previously contemplated. The Cabinet did not finish its deliberations on disarmament tonight and will resume them tomorrow.

16 Canadian Surgeons Are Accepted Fellows

CHICAGO, Oct. 13.—(C.P.)—Sixteen Canadian surgeons were accepted as Fellows of the American College of Surgeons in annual convocation tonight.

In all, 622 practicing physicians were admitted to the college's rolls, having submitted the required credentials including histories of 100 major operations, of which they themselves performed 50.
