THE ANTI-TUBERCULOSIS CRUSADE IN CANADA.

That there ought to be a federal department of health in Canada is a growing conviction. It will probably be attained in time. So far the care of the public health, except in so far as quarantine and marine hospitals are concerned, is a matter for the provincial and municipal authorities.

Tuberculosis is so widely prevalent and so fruitful of mortality that the combined forces of the federal, provincial and municipal forces might well be combined against it and they will probably be when the nation wakes up to the importance and gravity of the situation.

In the different Provinces of Canada a number of institutions and organizations have been established for the care of the tuberculous. Most of these have been brought into existence by social workers. Sometimes, however, provincial Governments have provided sanatoria, either wholly, or in part at their own expense.

With such a variety of institutions there has inevitably arisen an equal variety of means to support them, and sometimes a degree of confusion among those willing to contribute as to how their contributions should be directed.

Many of the institutions and organizations have done and are doing excellent work, but looking over the Dominion as a whole there seems to be a lack of general organization and system. Still, advance is being made and as the work progresses it is bearing good fruit in the reduced mortality and greater health and comfort of the communities where most of the active warfare is carried on.

Ontario leads in the good work, with two provincial and four municipal sanatoria, and four others of the latter class will be established in the near future. By various agencies much knowledge has been spread abroad with regard to the disease and the means of its prevention and cure.

The once prevalent belief that consumption was incurable has given way to hope for such cases as have not passed the incipient stage. Also it is much more generally recognized now than it formerly was that the disease is communicable, so that more precautions are taken than formerly to prevent its spread.

Also it is now known that fresh air, sunlight and good food are prime requisites for the treatment and cure of the afflicted ones. But an immense work has yet to be done before the now hoped-for suppression of the malady can be accomplished.

We have relatively few poor in this Province, but among them tuberculosis is perhaps the most prevalent malady and the one which is least likely to be properly cared for. Proper treatment with the precautionary measures necessary to prevent imparting the disease to others is expensive, and therefore too often neglected or omitted.

The patient is often for long periods of time incapable of doing any work, or may feel compelled to work when wholly unfit. And it must be realized that every case of tuberculosis is a source of danger not only to the patient but to the community. In this aspect of the matter it becomes sufficiently clear that the Provincial authorities have a duty to perform which has been but inadequately attended to in the past and which on humanitarian grounds and for the public welfare, must receive more earnest and effective attention in the future.

MR. DEACON'S LETTER.

We print this morning in another column an open letter from C. F. Deacon of this city to Premier Borden on the navy question. Mr. Deacon shares the opinion of many persons in this loyal Province that it is the duty of the Government of the day to do not less, but more for the defence of the Empire than the late Government was prepared to do.

This feeling is, we believe, generally prevalent and strong in eight of the nine Provinces of the Dominion. Premier Borden has, in our judgment, a striking opportunity to signalize his advent to power by resolutely taking up this duty, wiping away a reproach from Canada and placing the Dominion in its rightful position at the head of the British nations overseas.

But we feel that it is yet too soon to assume that the Government of the day will not rise to the occasion. Mr. Borden has been but a few months at the head of affairs, and much of that brief period has been occupied by the session of Parliament.

What Canada shall do toward assisting the Mother Country in the defence of the Empire and how it shall be done are grave and complicated matters. While there is a good deal of unanimity in the English Provinces, at least, as to our duty, there is by no means so much agreement as to manner in which that duty shall be discharged.
