## FOOD TO REACH STARVING POLAND

NEW YORK, N. Y., May 13.—Cable despatches from London last night, announced that through the efforts of John D. Rockefeller, Jr., and the Rockefeller Foundation and for the sake of starving Poland, the British government has so far modified its food blockade as to permit German ships flying a neutral flag, to carry foodstuffs to three million starving Poles.

Germany upon her part, has already agreed to contribute fifteen million marks (\$3,500,000) for the purchase of this food, and she has engaged to feed the 12,000,000 more Poles and Russia, now governed by her military staff. In addition, she gives the ships that will carry the food from New York and other ports, to Danzig, on the Baltic.


