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

Soviet Republic Sure in Germany

BERLIN, DEC. 4.—"Germany will be a Soviet Republic in from six months to two years," was the confident prophecy made by Dr. Friedrich August Karl Geyer, of Leipzig, a member of the Reichstag, and the new leader of the Independent Socialist party, succeeding the late Hugo Haase. Her Geyer said: "Radicalism is not receding in Germany, though it may seem so on the surface because of fewer strikes. At heart the masses are steadily growing more radical. The masses have fought to a state of exhaustion, but the present lull is only a breathing spell before the struggle for complete industrial democracy and the dictatorship of the proletariat."

"The Soviet Republic will become realized much quicker if Germany's reactionaries make a serious attempt to restore the monarchy. In this case the radicalized masses will rise, not to defend democracy, but to beat back monarchy. They will not wait there, but will go storming on over the debris of democracy and will set up a dictatorship of the proletariat in the form of a Soviet Republic."

"If the monarchist reactionaries do not attempt to start anything, the serious progress of Sovietism will be slower, perhaps peaceful, but the present evolution to a Soviet republic is the inevitable consequence of the effects of the world war."

To Begin at the Base.

According to Herr Geyer, the German Soviet republic will differ from the Russian model in that the Russian so-called "Betriebsraete" or factory Soviets either already exist or are being formed. These basic Soviets are further being co-ordinated into higher Soviets for the various industries. Soviets for the various industries are being pushed right up to the peak of proletarian power, so when the hour strikes for a dictatorship of the proletariat to seize the reins of Government, the machinery of the plan Bolsheviks began at the top by seizing power and then trying to organize downward. Germany's radicals, Herr Geyer said, are already ready to work perfecting the organization of their Soviet republic by beginning the organization at the base, working order and will function smoothly.

A serious new outbreak of industrial unrest is reported from Hamburg where the big Vulcan shipyards locked out all its employees. After the radical elements had gained the upper hand among the shipyard workers, the management regretfully announced the necessity of closing down the plant owing to sabotage, and active violence was announced as a continuation of the lockout until orderly conditions were restored.

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CIVIL SERVANTS ARE JUBILATING

Big Increase of Pay Granted Effective from Last April.

(Special to The Guardian.)
TORONTO, Dec. 5.—There is considerable jubilation in the ranks of the civil servants over a decision made by the cabinet council at Ottawa, the news of which reached Toronto today. The decision means a big sum of money for the civil servants and it is estimated that at least \$2,000,000 is involved. It will be remembered that at last session of the House of Commons the whole civil service was re-classified and this classification is declared by officials gave an increase in wages to nearly all the civil servants. (This dates back to April last.) The decision means that all civil servants in the Dominion will receive an increase in wages for a year more, and it means a very big sum in the pockets of the civil servants. The employees are busy reckoning up how much is coming to them under the new scale of wages, and how much back pay will come along as a result. Toronto employees give the credit for the government decision to Hon. N. W. Rowell's persistence in urging their claims.

President Will Confer On Mexican Situation

OTTAWA, Dec. 5.—Sir Douglas Hazen, Chief Justice of New Brunswick left for home early today after a brief visit to the capital. It is stated that before he left he sent to St. John papers a denial of the report that his entry into the Borden cabinet was imminent and characterized the statement as without foundation. It is said that Sir Douglas would not accept any department but that of Justice and rejected the Customs portfolio where the vacancy at present exists.
