## TAG DAY FOR MAR. OLYMPIC ASPIRANTS SET FOR APRIL 19

Amateur Officials Expect to Raise About \$2,500 For Training Purposes—Maritime Amateur Baseball Association to be Formed.—Considerable Business at Semi-annual at Truro.

The expense attendant to putting Maritime aspirants for Canada's Olympic team in proper shape for the final trials at Montreal early this summer will be raised by means of a Tag Day throughout the provinces on April 19, provided municipal authorities will co-operate, according to a decision reached at the semi-annual meeting of the M. P. B. A. U. of C. at Truro recently. Local representatives who attended, including President A. W. Covey, P. J. Legge, secretary-treasurer, Arnold Kee, Y. M. C. A., and Paul Quinn, Y. M. C. A., returned home yesterday and speak optimistically of plans for a Tag Day. The entire matter was thrashed out at an evening meeting in Truro. Mr. Covey, who was quite sick in the morning, was able to be present at the evening session, and put the case for the Maritime boys strongly. He said that there were about three boxes and about 10 or 12 track men who should be put in proper condition if they were to represent the Maritimes. He thought about \$2,500 would cover all expenses. It was finally decided that a special committee be appointed by the president to handle the matter.

### Baseball Association

Another important decision reached at the meeting was that concerning the formation of a Maritime Amateur Baseball Association, M. C. Ralston, of the Nova Scotia Baseball Association, spoke in favor of the new organization. He said the annual meeting of the Nova Scotia organization was scheduled for the latter part of this month. This, however, will be postponed until New Brunswick is thoroughly organized and then representatives of both associations will meet and form a baseball association along lines taken by the hockey association this winter. A formal resolution was adopted granting complete control in baseball matters to the new association when fully organized.

### Pool Expenses

A proposal was placed before the meeting by President Covey that each affiliated club pay for one delegate's train and hotel expenses to the semi-annual and the annual meetings and these amounts be pooled and have every club pay the same amount. By adopting this policy, the meeting could be held anywhere desired in the Maritime Provinces—a plan that cannot be followed under the present system. The secretary was instructed to write the various clubs, explaining the aims and objects, in order that delegates be fully informed when the matter comes before the annual meeting of the branch next fall.

In connection with the complaint regarding levity in handling business of the branch in P. E. I., the executive was given power to take action.

### Dinghy Races

A rather interesting announcement was made respecting dinghy races that have been placed on the Olympic programme. The meeting was told that the Canadian trials would be held about the middle of July at Toronto. A standard wake has been adopted and these boats will be ready in time for the trials. They are of the same design as those which will be used at the Olympics. "It was a fine gathering," said P. J. Legge, secretary-treasurer, on his return. "We enjoyed the hospitality accorded us by Truro people, even though our stay was short."

## BASEBALL

The Red Sox played and won their first ball game of the season, Saturday afternoon, by defeating the Orioles 11-5. The game was fast and some nice plays were made. McNutt, of the Red Sox, opened the fifth inning with a home run, and Grant followed suit also, by dropping the ball over the fence in the seventh. E. Vessey and G. Raymond were the officials of the game. Next game to be played this afternoon.
