Anniversary of our High Court twenty years have rolled by since the Independent Order of Foresters was established in our Province, for on the 24th day of August, in the year 1883 Court Abegweit was instituted in Charlottetown, followed in the same year by Court Chataqua Summerside, Onaway (Alberton), Minnawawa (Bedeque), Silvan (Montague), St John (Souris), by Rev S O Wells, D S C Ranger. The Society at that time was weak and little known outside of New Jersey; Ontario and New Brunswick having only seven thousand members and thirty thousand dollars of accumulated funds, contrasting singularly with its position of to-day with nearly one quarter of a million members and over ten million dollars of funds.

In our small jurisdiction the growth of the Order has been most encouraging. After allowing for all losses we should have nearly two thousand members—one hundred for each year of our existence. In celebrating this our Twentieth Anniversary you will, I am sure, all regret with me that we are not privileged to have with us our distinguished Chief, Dr Ornlly's ekhs. The necessity of his being in Toronto to answer the call of the Insurance Commissioners makes it impossible for him to be with us at this meeting. We are pleased, however, to have this representative, the Rev J J Courtney, P H C Ranger of the Province of Ontario. I ask you to join with me in giving him a most cordial welcome.
