- Oxo Tomato Omelet**
2 Tomatoes, 1/2 oz. Butter, 1 or 2 Cubes Oxo, 3 Eggs, Pepper and Salt.
Skin and cut up the tomatoes. Put them in a lined saucepan with the butter, and heat with a little hot water. Season to taste. When thoroughly cooked, mash well; break in the eggs, and stir over the fire till thick. Spread on buttered toast, and garnish with parsley.
- Oxo Meat Patties**
Scrap of Cold Meat, 2 Cubes Oxo, 1 lb. Onions, 4 Little Parsley, Sauce and Seasoning, Some Flour paste.
Mince the meat and make it savory with the sauce, etc. Line some patty-pans with the paste. Fill with the mixture, add the Oxo to half a cup of boiling water, and add a little to each pan. Put on the top, and bake till pastry is done. A little egg may be brushed over the tops, if desired.
- Oxo Sausage Pie**
1 lb. of Beef or Pork Sausages, 1 or 2 Cubes Oxo, 1 lb. Onions, 4 Little Parsley, Pepper and Salt, 1/2 Pint Water.
Grease a pie-dish, and lay at the bottom the sausages; sprinkle with pepper and salt. Peel and cut onion into small pieces, and lay over the sausages. Mix the Oxo with the water, which must be hot, and pour over the contents of the dish. Dot tiny pieces of dripping on the top, and bake in the oven for 2 hours.
- Oxo Onion Sauce**
1 lb. Spanish Onions, A Little Flour, 2 Oxo Cubes, 2 Cups Water.
Cut the onions into thin slices; fry in dripping until a nice brown; mix the Oxo in 1/2 pint hot water; put into a saucepan with onions, and add 2 pints water. Simmer for 1 hour; thicken with flour; bring to the boil, and serve.

BLACK MASS ORGY RECALLED

PARIS, Jan. 14.—The mysterious death, in his luxurious villa at Capri of Baron Jacques d'Adelsward de Ferson, whose body was said by order of the Italian Police when being conveyed to Rome for cremation, has again set all Paris talking of the "Black Mass" scandals of a few years ago in which he was the leading figure. Baron d'Adelsward was at first stated to have died at the dinner table, but his sister, Princess de Bugnano, wife of an Italian Senator, now alleges that he was poisoned by the friend to whom he had bequeathed the whole of his immense fortune.
In regard to the "Black Mass" orgies, which led to the arrest and imprisonment of Baron d'Adelsward, it is now stated that they were a plot against him in order to prevent his marriage into one of the oldest families of France.

LONDON, Jan. 14.—Doctors have begun to protest against the perilous practices adopted by thousands of young women and girls in order to bring their figures into conformity with the "pipe-stem" outline now fashionable.
The pipe-stem fashion demands the complete obliteration of curves and a straight unbroken line from neck to knee.
Many girls, some of them not yet twenty years of age, swathe their bodies to a mummy-like rigidity in their efforts to obtain the straight line. Some even tighten bandage the body in wide strips of sticking plaster. Breathing under such intense pressure becomes difficult, and the lungs are cramped.
"It is a thousand times more dangerous than the old-fashioned tight lacing," said a Harley-street specialist on discussing the new mode. "In the tightlacing days only a part of the body was restricted, but now these women and girls place abnormal pressure on the stomach and chest organs.
"The straight silhouette may be aesthetically beautiful, but it is full of peril for future generations."
