U.S. Liner Encounters Heavy Seas

PLYMOUTH, Eng., Dec. 3.—The United States liner American Farmer, steamed into port 36 hours late today after battling a terrific gale and 50-foot waves in mid-Atlantic.

"It was one of the worst gales I have ever experienced," said Captain Ferguson. "The seas were the highest I have ever seen."

So bad were conditions, with a 100-mile wind hurling enormous combers against the vessel, that the Captain was forced to skirt the storm by cruising for 24 hours to the southward.

ARRESTS FOLLOW ASSASSINATION

Chief Commissariat of Leningrad And Six Assistants Removed From Office.

(A. P. By Guardian's Special Wire)

MOSCOW, Dec. 3.—Thirty-five "White Guards" from the Leningrad region and 32 others from the Moscow area were arrested tonight and charged with preparation of terroristic acts against officials of the U.S.S.R., presumably in connection with the assassination of Sergei Kiroff, secretary of the central executive committee.

The arrests followed the central committee's decree invoking anew the death penalty for Russian terrorists and providing swift trial and prompt execution of penalties, with no appeal from death sentences.

Shown Negligence

In addition to the arrests, the chief administration of the commissariat of home affairs at Leningrad, named Medvedev, together with six of his responsible assistants, was removed from office for negligence in safeguarding the state's security.

It was announced that "White Guards" will be tried by a military collegium of the Supreme Court. Medvedev and his assistants also are to face trial. Medvedev was replaced temporarily by vice-commissioner Agramoff at Leningrad, it was announced. The names of the former's assistants who were removed and committed to trial with him were given as Fomin, Gorin, Loboff, Vanishevsky, Petroff, Palzovich and Mosevich.
