PARIS, Nov. 2.—The Castellane divorce case was heard yesterday before M. Henry Dite, president of the tribunal of first instance of the Seine. Neither the count nor the countess was present. Maitre Cruppi, for the countess, pleaded for a divorce upon the documentary evidence submitted.

S. A. LARGEST LODGING HOUSE

BOSTON, Nov. 1.—What is claimed to be the largest lodging house in the world was thrown open to working men today. It is known as the People's Palace, and was erected by the Salvation Army in the South End, at a cost of \$240,000. It is five stories in height, contains 281 lodging rooms, reading and social rooms, a swimming pool and baggage rooms. Attached to the hotel will be a free labor bureau and a free dispensary.

In an extended review counsel declared that the countess at beginning of the suit was not acting under influence, but solely for the purpose of ending forever the moral desolation of her household.
Maitre Cruppi asked that the countess be given the custody of her three children.

The court room was crowded, among those present being many members of the American Colony Counsel for the countess spoke for an hour and a half and had not finished when the court took a recess. His presentation of the plaintiff's case constituted a complete and pitiful story of the wreck of her married life, due primarily to the Count's inordinate extravagance. Even in spite of their domestic infelicity the Countess was too good and scrupulous to begin an action for divorce until she possessed full proof. She was only twenty when she was married in 1893, and Maitre Cruppi asserted the happiness of the honeymoon was disturbed on their arrival in Paris by the Count's demands for money. The Countess' income was then \$700,000, and the Count allowed her \$80,000 a year.

By 1899, the Countess' interests were so heavily compromised by the Count's extravagance that it necessitated a family meeting in New York and the appointment of a legal trustee. But the difficulties regarding money were unceasing, and in order to obtain funds, the Count pawned or sold at ridiculous prices the most costly objects. When the Countess protested the Count hit her in the presence of servants, and when she declined to attach her signature to documents he frequently pinched her and sometimes struck her, the first time being four months after their marriage. In the course of the pleading, Maitre Cruppi protested against the "malicious" reports in regard to the Countess' intentions, and announced that she would leave France for America immediately after a divorce is granted her. In recounting the Count's infidelity, the first instance cited by counsel was that of a married woman described as "Madame A.", in 1898. The correspondence was conducted through M. Morel, the count's secretary. The countess accidentally discovered in the Castellane chateau a packet of love letters, and when she protested the count struck her. The countess eventually placed the letters in the custody of a lawyer. Maitre Cruppi read passionate extracts from one of the love letters fixing a rendezvous at Dijon. Counsel also detailed two alliances with "Madame B." and "Madame C.," whom the count met in apartments which he rented in different parts of Paris. Maitre Cruppi had not finished his presentation of the case when the hearing was adjourned until next week.
