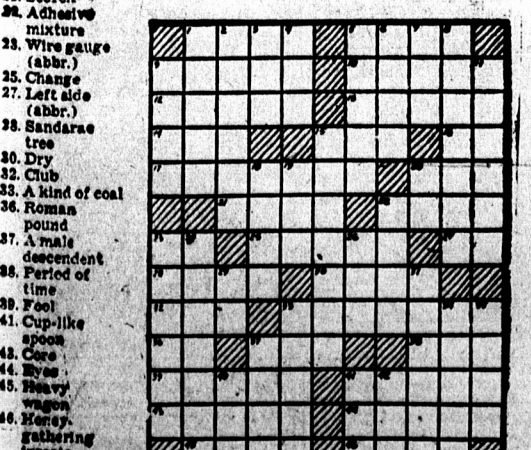

SYRACUSE, N. Y., Feb. 8.—(AP)—40-year-old mother of triplets gave birth to her second set today, making medical history in eight minutes flat.

Mrs. Margaret Walker felt a bit "groggy" but otherwise okay, hospital attaches said, and the triplets appeared healthy. They had been expected.

The American Medical Association said it had no previous record of two live sets born to the same parents. To the father, Michael Walker, a repairman, news of the 17-pound two ounce trio was a signal to buy cigars. The Walkers now have nine children. The oldest is 16. Where they all will sleep in their four-bedroom home is a question.

First to arrive today was a six-pound boy, at 12:06 p.m. A five-pound, 4-1/2 ounce girl followed. The third, another girl, weighed in at five pounds, 13-1/2 ounces, eight minutes after her brother. Mrs. Walker normally weighs about 135 pounds. She had wanted all girls. Advised "everything is fine" Walker slumped into a chair at the hospital. "Guess I better start buying the cigars," he said.
