Airwomen Overseas Getting Head Start

WITH THE R.C.A.F. OVERSEAS, March 18. — (CP) — Airwomen of the R.C.A.F. in Britain are getting a head start toward post-war jobs or an education interrupted when war called them to service, by spare-time study of languages, typing, domestic science and mathematics.

"Languages are the most popular study among airwomen," says Lt.-L. E. E. Spence of Peterborough, Que., supervisor of school grants at Air Force headquarters here. "Living in England made Canadians world-conscious and whether they plan to work in England or return to Canada after the war, they know that languages will help them."

Romance inspired two members of the division to learn Norwegian. L.A.W. Margaret Fiske (former Margaret Knickle) of Lanesville, N.S., and Squadron Officer Betty Ferguson (formerly Betty Bacon) of Toronto, married Norwegian servicemen and will live in Norway after the war.

(Issued under the authority of the Emergency Shelter Regulations, Order-in-Council, P.C. 9439, December 19, 1944)

WARNING

TO ALL PERSONS PLANNING TO MOVE TO

Victoria · Vancouver · New Westminster

Hamilton · Toronto · Ottawa · Hull

As part of a plan to meet congested conditions, all persons who propose to rent or occupy family quarters in any of these Emergency Shelter Areas are required by Board order first to obtain a permit from the Administrator of Emergency Shelter for the district.

The purpose of the order is to help those who must b, in these areas to obtain necessary accommodation.

Before completing arrangements to move to any of these districts, write to the Administrator for full particulars of the Emergency Shelter Regulations as they apply to that district.

THIS IS THE LAW

No person may move to and rent or occupy family quarters in any of these districts without an Administrator's permit Form E.S. 1.

VICTORIA · NEW WESTMINSTER · VANCOUVER · HAMILTON · TORONTO · OTTAWA · HULL

Every person who rents or occupies family quarters in any of these districts contrary to the order, commits an offence and, in addition to other penalties, will be required by the Administrator to vacate the shelter and the district at his own expense.

The Emergency Shelter Regulations provide serious penalties for hindering or obstructing these efforts and for any contravention of the regulations or of an order of the Board or of the Administrators.
