QUARTERLY BOARD.—The Fourth Quarterly Board of the Methodist Church, Murray Harbor, was held on the evening of May 30th. The reports of the year in all departments were presented and showed progress. THE INWARD TRAINS.—The eastern express arrived in Charlottetown yesterday at 9.30 a. m., on time; the eastern accommodation at 5.40 p. m. one hour and ten minutes late; the western accommodation at 11.50 a. m. ten minutes late and the Cape Traverse at 10.10 a. m., fifteen minutes late.

CAR DERAILED.—Yesterday afternoon, about one o'clock, a freight car of No. 2 train, the western express, from Tynish to Summerside, was derailed at Alberton. At the time of the accident the car, loaded with potatoes, was being shunted at the Alberton station, where the train had stopped, and no serious damage resulted. The car was put back on the track with no delay to the train which proceeded to Charlottetown.
