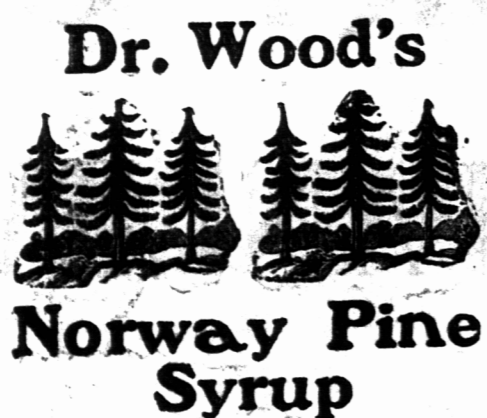

Miss MAUD WISNER of Alberton, crossed by the Stanley yesterday in route to Wallaston Heights, Mass., to spend a month visiting her sister, Mrs. Chas. Maxwell.

THE Stanley left Summerside on the arrival of the express train from Charlottetown yesterday taking 20 passengers, about 300 bundles of pelts, 200 boxes of smelts, 111 dressed hogs and sundries. The steamer returned from Cape Tormentine about a quarter of five with four passengers, 45 bags mail and one car mixed freight.

An adjourned meeting of the town council was held last night with the full board present. After the passing of a number of bills a motion was passed adding \$75 to the salary of the town clerk for the year just ending. On motion it was ordered that all insurance companies doing business in Summerside failing to pay their taxes be sued. Four propositions were offered by the electric light company, viz, they would renew the present contract for three years; they would give the present number of lights from dark until daylight for \$493 additional they would add seven lights to those already installed for total sum of \$1,000; or they would add seven lights and give an all night service for a total sum of \$1,500 on three years contract. On motion it was decided to renew the present contract for one year. The finance committee's report recommended a number of changes re the publication of the town accounts, viz:—that the capital account and financial statement as published heretofore be omitted as being unnecessary and confusing to the ordinary rate-payer; that the sum of \$1500 paid by the town to retire the school Debentures be charged to property account and that the Summerside High School Building and Land be included in the inventory of Property. The report was on motion accepted. After an informal discussion re the enforcement of the C. T. A., the Council adjourned.

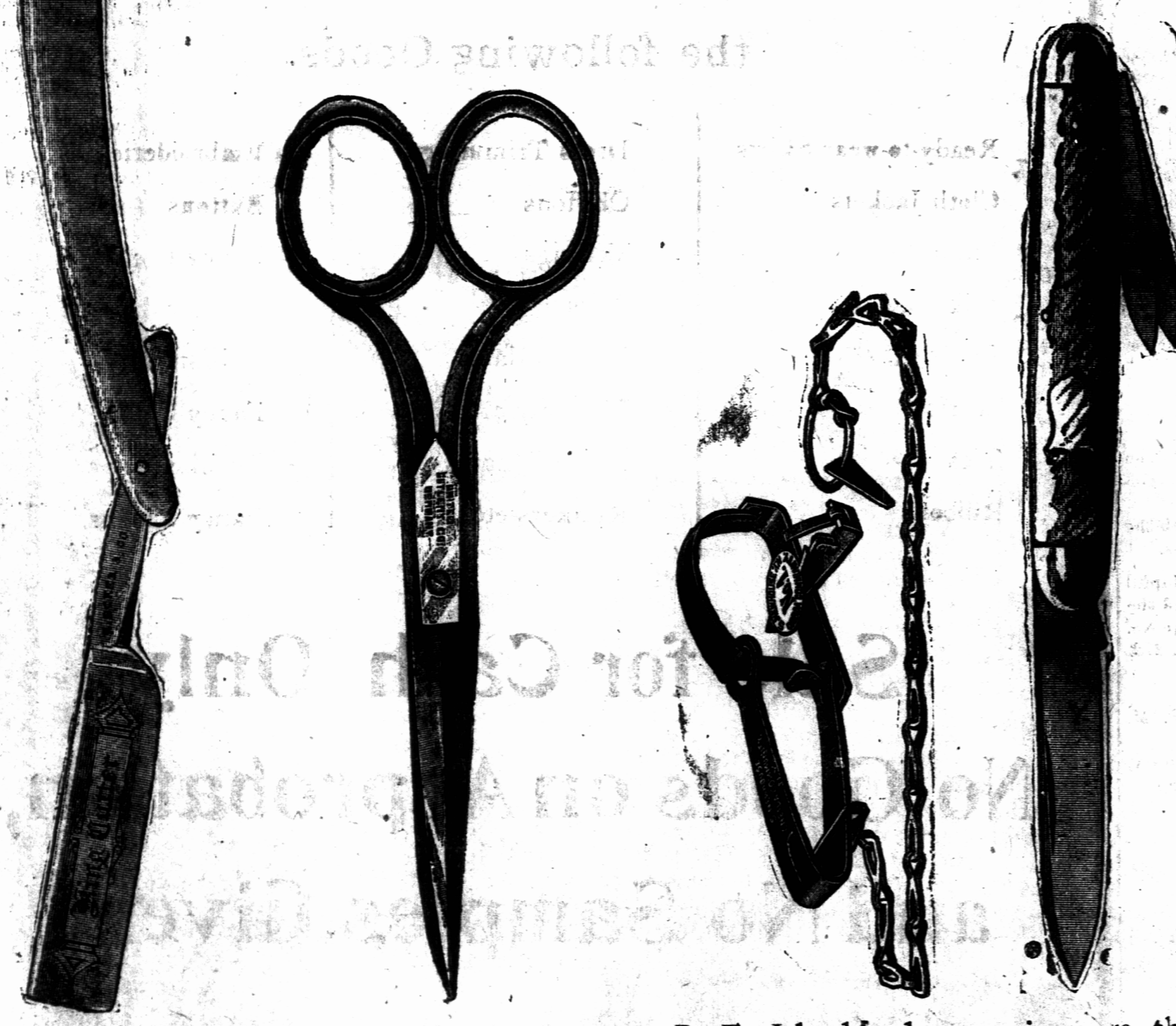
