Big Vote, Close Decisions, Seen In Wide Survey

HALIFAX, Oct. 30—The reports received from towns and villages in every County of the Province, indicate a large vote tomorrow, with the final results very much in doubt, due, the prognosticators say, to the "silent vote." From these reports, it is gathered that King's Hants, Colchester, Shelburne, Lunenburg, Annapolis and Yarmouth Counties are expected to show majorities, of varying size, for the Nova Scotia Temperance Act.

They had queued up for a chance to ballot on private members' motions. And as the Speaker took his seat there were members everywhere. Every bench was packed. Beyond the mystic line of the Bar, more members stood, unable to find a seat in the Chamber. To the right, the Government sat without a clear majority, calmly announcing a heavy program of contentious legislation.
