GOVT. RECORD A GOOD ONE

Lord Byng Wins In Popularity

(Special to The Guardian.)

TORONTO, Nov. 29.—An appeal for maintenance of the spirit of co-operation that did so much to turn the tide toward victory in the great war was made by His Excellency the Governor General in an address to the members of the Women's Canadian Club in Convention Hall yesterday afternoon. The women folk of the men who Lord Byng led at Vimy Ridge, crowded the spacious auditorium and gave him a warm welcome. He responded with a brief address, direct, composed of sentiment, humor and thoughtful comment upon the trend of affairs today, the drift back to individualism, which means the loss of much that was gained by common sacrifice and suffering during the dark days of struggle. Lord Byng won the sympathy of his hearers at the outset by his frank recognition of the fact that he was being sized up, as he was sized up at the outset by the Canadians in France. "I am a little anxious about the verdict," he confessed modestly, "the verdict I think will be satisfactory in France, and I can only throw myself on your mercy and try to obtain the same verdict from you."

OWENSOUND, Nov. 29.—Dealing with the record of the Government in an address before the electors of North Grey in the Classic Theatre last night, Mr. Meighen claimed it had been conducted as a public business in such a way as to command the support, not only of those who were its traditional followers, but those who were its traditional opponents. In regard to the railway situation Mr. Meighen remarked Mr. King wanted to be in a position to support public ownership or return the National System to private control, as Mr. Gouin and others of the Liberal party dictated.

Home Secretary Is Sanguine

LONDON, Nov. 29.—Home secretary Edward Shortt, speaking at Berwick-on-Tweed last night on Irish affairs said "we are in as delicate a position regarding Ireland as was ever known. I perhaps am more sanguine than others in believing we could produce a set of arrangements which would settle once and for all centuries of old trouble and make Ireland a contented part of the Empire."

BLUEBEARD TRIAL NEARS THE END

VERSAILLES, Nov. 29.—The spectre of the Guillotine hovered about the dingy little Versailles court room yesterday afternoon as Prosecutor Godfrey in summing up against Henri Landru, alleged murderer of ten women and a boy drew a picture of horror and depravity which brought forth gasps and muttered imprecations from his audience against the so called Bluebeard of Gambais.

Germany Possesses a "Sea of Alcohol"

BERLIN, Nov. 29.—Germany has a "sea of alcohol" which would cover an area of sixty acres to a depth of three and a quarter feet.

This statement is made by an expert in the Vossische Zeitung today. In fluid measure the quantity of alcohol on hand at the present time is given as 1,500,000 hectoliters, or approximately 35,000,000 gallons.

This sea of alcohol is valued at a billion marks.

Landru Is Normal Physicians State

VERSAILLES, Nov. 28.—Fernande Segret, a woman who lived with Henri Landru, alleged "Bluebeard" of Gambais, in one of his apartments in Versailles and also in Gambais, from late in 1917 until Landru was arrested in April, 1919, charged with 11 murders, was the principal witness for the defence today.

Mlle. Segret testified that Landru was perfectly normal mentally, that he was loving and attentive to her, and not cruel. Her testimony regarding the normal condition of the prisoner was supported by Doctors Vallen, Rubenovitch and Dubuisson, who arrived at the conclusion that the accused man was rational, and responsible for his actions.

"You accuse me of heinous crimes, such as only a mad man could commit, and the greatest specialists in France swear that I am normal and rational," Landru told the court, adding: "It proves my innocence."

Dr. Rubinovitch, in his testimony eliminated the hypothesis of hypnosis and "depersonalization" by Landru of his alleged victims, which would make it possible that they now were living, but had completely forgotten their names. This theory has been advanced in some quarters. Dr. Rubinovitch said he never had heard of such a science, and Landru would be the greatest discoverer in psychics if he had succeeded in applying it.
