Every season adds to this experience, and in conversation with us he stated that in the future he expects to inaugurate a number of plans whereby he will be able to control the disposal of silver fox pelts to a far greater degree than at present, and in some way obtain greatly increased prices for the rancher who desires to sell his pelts through the Sales Board."

THE FARMERS MAY SETTLE THE WAR

LONDON, February 25.—Reports of the Reichstag debate and vote of credit show plainly that Germany is fully prepared to make further financial sacrifices and that all thoughts of an early peace have vanished. Non-combatants are to fight economic battles equally as important as the war in France and on the high seas. The amateur farmers of Britain and Germany will affect the final issue almost as much as the trained soldiers. The German pacifists, as represented by the socialist minority, have no more influence. On both sides the feeling has hardened.

All the grim bitterness of the early days of the struggle has returned. The people are steeled to fight to the finish and the spirit to give and take is gone.

Indications of this are found in the suspension of negotiations for the exchange of civil and military prisoners, threats and counter-threats and declaration demand indemnities. Whoever sees any hope of an early cessation of hostilities must be either a fool or a super-optimist.

"I am told," Overman exclaimed, "there are now 100,000 spies on United States soil."

Overman as member of the Judiciary committee in charge of the bill, has been in close touch with the Department of Justice, which drafted the measure.

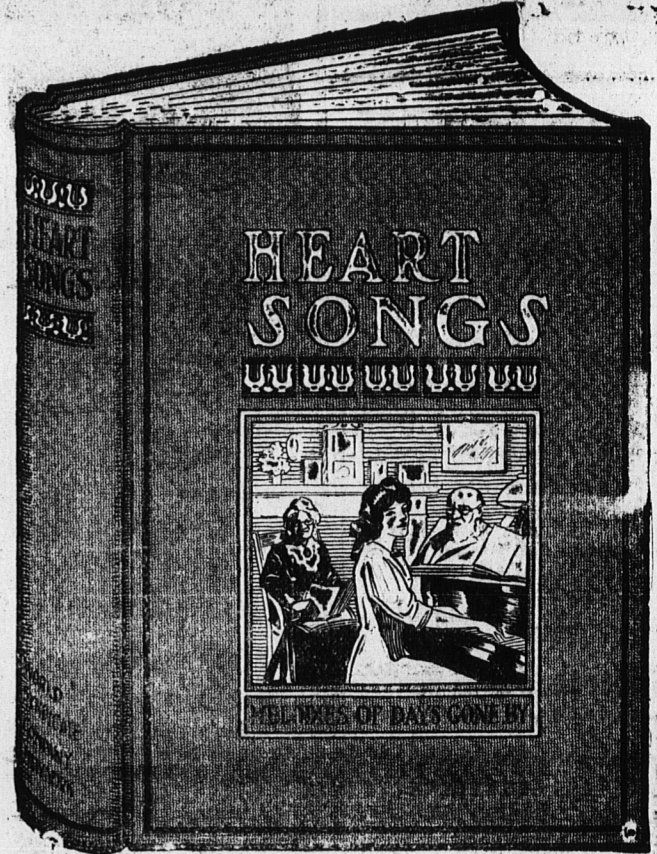
