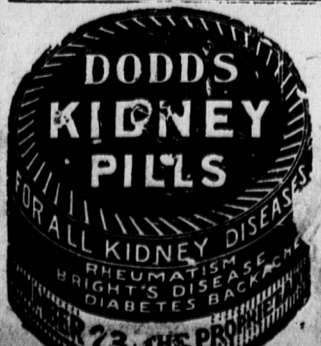
FOX COMPANIES: QUERY

Sir:—I have read "Shareholder's" timely letter under the caption "FOX COMPANIES: QUERY" in your issue of the 4th inst., and it occurs to me that his lawyer would quickly dispose of the question as to the legality of the action of certain fox breeding companies in parting with a portion of their annual increase to stockholders in exchange for the surrender shares.

Knowing the capable management of one company which has recently adopted this policy I am satisfied that the proper authority had been obtained in advance. It is assumed that this concern intends to maintain its breeding herd at its present number of pairs, using but a small part of its annual product for this capitalization reducing process. Doubtless there are shareholders so situated that they believe they can handle the foxes more economically than the companies can, and these shareholders welcome the opportunity to try. They may succeed—doubtless some will—but where the shareholder who is not surrendering his stock is going to suffer, I fail to see.

If Mr. "Shareholder" will sit down and figure out where he will stand after, say, five years in this stock-reducing process, I am sure he will be quite willing to let it go on. Verbum sap.

Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations

THE sole head of a family or any male over eighteen years of age, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency but not Sub-Agency on certain conditions.

Duties—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section along side his homestead. Price \$400 per acre.
Duties Six months residence in each of three years after earning homestead patent; also 50 acres extra cultivation. Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent, on certain conditions.
A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$200 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate 50 acres and erect house worth \$500.
The area of cultivation is subject to reduction in case of rough, scrubby or stony land. Live stock may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions.

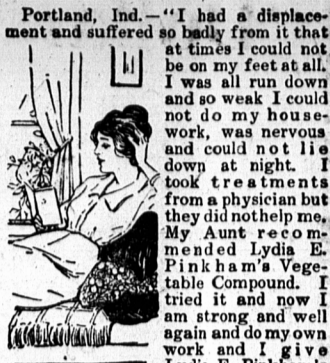
