Proposal in Congress to Transfer the Spanish Fleet to the U.S. Navy.

WASHINGTON, July 5.—The house committee on foreign to-day introduced the following resolution:

"Joint resolution tendering of congress to Commodore Sampson, and the officers and men command."

"Resolved, that the thanks of the American people be hereby tendered to Commodore U. S. N., and to the officers and distinguished conduct in the Spanish fleet in Cuban waters the third of July last."

The resolution was referred to a naval affairs committee.

Mr. Berry, in speaking of his resolution, said:

A Great Programme of Coast Defences.

LONDON July 5.—The Evening Standard says:—The Government will in a few days a great shipbuilding programme involving the use of available ship in Government dockyards. It is also proposed that special act will be passed by Parliament authorizing the acquisition of Government of all warships built in England for foreign stations in the Indies and the extension of the plant. The idea of an all-British fleet, the strengthening of coaling and cable system throughout the world will be carried out.
