STEADEFAST Division, Hampton, held a very interesting and successful meeting on Monday evening last, 18th inst. After the transaction of routine business, the Division took up the debate proposed for the evening, viz., "Should the franchise be extended to women?" Bro. D. J. Mullin opened the debate, arguing strongly against woman suffrage. Bro. Fred Ince responded in his usual fluent style presenting quite an array of reasons in favor of his side of the question. Several other members took part in the discussion which proved to be one of the liveliest and best that took place in the Division. The vote taken at the close showed that a large majority were in favor of extending the franchise to women. Then following the intellectual feast, came a pleasant surprise when in response to a signal from the W.
