Trading Light Yesterday On Stock Exchanges

NEW YORK, Nov. 18—(AP)—Supply and demand were almost evenly balanced today in the slowest stock market in three months. Changes were mostly fractional although there were a handful of wider swings.

Several timid attempts to get ahead were immediately blocked. At the same time any increase in selling pressure attracted instant support.

Turnover dropped to 78,000 shares, a low since only 510,000 changed hands on Aug. 16. Yesterday's business amounted to 970,000 shares.

The Associated Press average of 60 stocks advanced 1 of one point to 64.7. A gain in the industrial component outweighed a small loss in the railroad section.

**At Montreal**

MONTEAL, Nov. 18—(CP)—Selected industrials rallied near the close of trading on the Montreal Stock Exchange and Curb Market today until gains narrowly edged out losses. All gains were fractional. Trading was light and only 10 issues had turnovers exceeding 1,000 shares each.

Mines were about mixed as trading remained active. Yesterday's business amounted to 36,000 shares. Mines totalled 250,000 shares, a decrease of 75,900 shares from the previous day.
