OVER one million Chinese Scriptures sold last year. The Bible Society reports remarkable sales of the Scriptures in China last year, where the total number of copies circulated was 1,066,070 copies. Of these, 34,873 were free grants made for special purposes, which leaves the actual sales well over a million copies—though the books are sold much below cost price. This far outstrips all previous records, and is a further indication of the desire the Chinese are now showing to examine for themselves the Book of the Christian religion.
