"This pie," said he, "is not at all like mother used to bake." His wife's remarks, however, were like mother used to make.



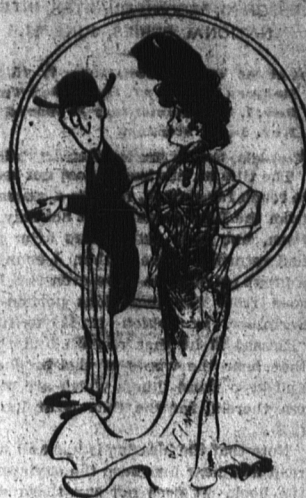
HIS HOBBIES.

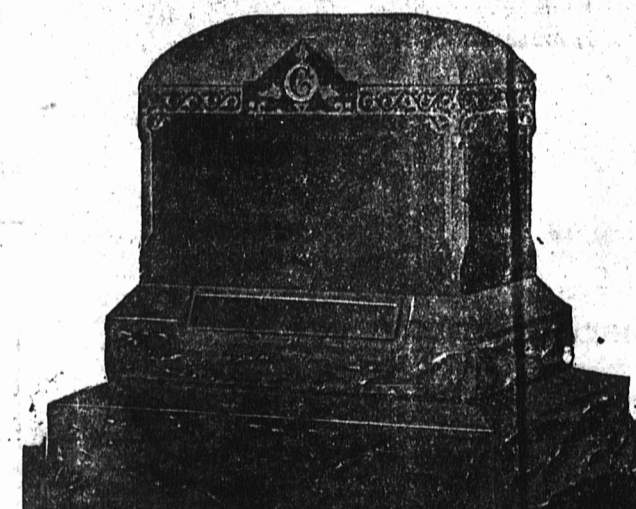
PRETTY NEAR IT.
