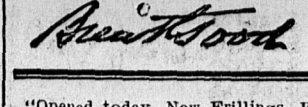

SEED GROWING.— Considerable interest is being taken throughout the province in the proposal that farmers should raise their own turnip, cabbage and other vegetable seed. It should be borne in mind that preparation must be made at once, that is, that turnips must be selected in the field, then pulled, and at least two inches of the top left on them. The roots must not be trimmed too close. They should then be stored in a cool cellar or pitted in a sheltered place. It is important that this should be attended to as there is likely to be a great scarcity of seed on account of the present war.
