He was seen passing the Steel Works by Robert Mathieson, the night boss, who spoke to him and asked him where he was going. He replied that he was going to his daughter's. That was the last seen of him alive. His body was found in the woods.

The Women's Missionary Aid Society did splendid work during the year and a most interesting report was given by Miss Waldman. G. B. Norton reported for the Trustees.
