**COLLEGE game tonight.**  
THE first few days of March have been quite lamb-like.

THE Stanley and Minto each made good crossings yesterday. The mails reached the city at 1.45.

A HEAVY thunder and lightning storm passed over the city last night about ten o'clock. The lightning was quite sharp.

AMONG the presents received by Mrs. Ambrose Road on the eve of her wedding was an antique oak parlor table from her fellow boarders at the Mitchell House.

The Dominion government steamer Elinor, which is in winter quarters at Charlottetown, will come here to go into dry dock as soon after the ice breaks up as possible.—Halifax Herald.

THE little schooner Nellie M. Snow, 61 tons register, which has been tied up in East Boston for some time, has been sold to Prince Edward Island parties. She was built in Boothbay in 1873 for Province town parties, by whom she was sold.—Halifax Chronicle.

THE device designed by Superintendent Sharpe for widening the snow cuttings in the Railway was given its second test yesterday at noon near the Royalty Junction. The shovels were greatly strengthened by chains and on their rear ends were pieces of sheet iron to push the snow further back. The machine will need to be lowered somewhat yet to be most effective.

witness that he had \$1,100 in a bank. At the same time he gave an order for more carriages, which he promised to pay for last December. He didn't want to draw the \$1,100 to pay on the carriages, because if he did he would be handicapped in purchasing produce through the country. Witness found on record a judgment against the defendant for \$3,330.63, which was taken by J. D. McKinnon, of the Northwest, a brother. The defendant upon being told that was not a bona fide judgment, replied, we do things sometimes that we wouldn't want to do. The defendant said last October that he bought a farm for his son. The son was to get money from Scotland, and in the spring would reimburse him for what he had paid on the farm. The court then adjourned. The result of yesterday's conclusion of the trial is given in our special despatch above.
