This is a series of articles pertaining to maintenance and repair of your Automobile. We will be glad to answer through this column, questions regarding your car or its mechanism.

The pistons in your car are a portion of the reciprocating mechanism in a 4 cycle motor as used in all automobiles.

The piston makes two complete revolutions in each explosion. Start ing from the top. On its downward stroke it draws in gas from the carburetor. The upward stroke compresses it into the small space called the combustion chamber. At his point the spark jumps the gap in the spark plug and the explosion takes place. The piston then descends, this being called the power stroke. The upward travel expels the burned gas from the cylinder. The next downward stroke compresses this operation over again, commencing at the intake.

In another article the rings on the piston will be dealt with to show how they facilitate and perfect the action of the piston.

H. J. K. QUES.—There is a tap in my radiator at the bottom of the push that none of the lower guides are in good condition and see where the trouble exists. It would not be well however, to attend to this part before easier places are adjusted first. The valve mechanism can be moved by taking off nuts and excessive clear clamps of engine housing.

ANS.—It will be necessary for you to check the lamp that is dim for perfect ground contact; see that the lamp is tight on the bracket; the bracket tight on the fender; the plug tight in the socket, being sure that all these contacts are perfectly clean.

This will without doubt brighten the dim lamp. Assuming of course, that the lamp is in good side and lateral condition. It would be well to try another lamp first.

Recipes

Raspberry Jam

CRUSH WELL about 2 quarts ripe berries in several portions so that each berry is mashed. Measure 4 level cups crushed berries into large kettle. Add 1 level cup sugar and mix well. Use hottest fire and stir constantly before and while boiling. BOIL HARD for ONE minute; remove from fire and stir in 1/2 bottle (scant 1/2 cup) Certo. From time jam is taken off fire, let stand not over 5 minutes; by the clock, before pouring. In the meantime, skim and stir occasionally to cool slightly. Use sure recipe for Strawberry, Blackberry or Loganberry Jam.

Cherry Jam

Pit and CRUSH WELL about 2 1/2 lbs. cherries (sour cherries give finest flavor). Measure 4 level cups of the crushed, pitted cherries into large kettle, add 1/2 cup water. The 3 tablespoons of pits in cloth and crush with hammer. Place with cherries to increase flavor. Stir until boiling, cover kettle, simmer 10 minutes; then remove pits. Add 1/2 level cup sugar and mix well. Use hottest fire and stir constantly before and while boiling. BOIL HARD for ONE minute. Remove from fire and stir in 1 bottle Certo. Allow to stand, with occasional stirring, 5 minutes only, by the clock. Skim and pour into glasses.
