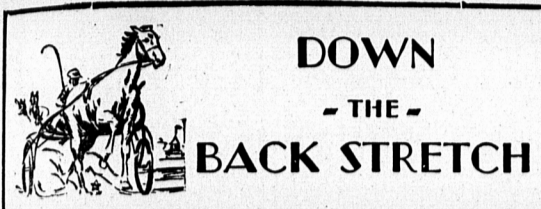

Clarence Schuman training for Charles Chandler has the ever reliable trotting champion, Lusty Pisco 2.07 1/4, the five-year-old Margaret's Abbe 2.16 1/2 and a two-year-old, Jolly Frisco by Lusty Pisco 2.07 1/4 out of Jollyset 2.16 1/2...

John L. Dodge, proprietor of Hollywood Farm near Lexington, and one of the best known trotting horsemen in the world, died at 2.15 1/2 out of Adeline Gray 2.16 1/2 and Presto Kalmuck, a three-year-old by Kalmuck out of Harvest Maid. This young pacer is owned by Alfred McNeill. Joe has a two-year-old filly, Glamour Girl, which he purchased in Maine last year...

Peter Reaper 2.07 1/2 has been sold by Herb Vandierstine to John J. McIntyre, Mount Stewart, but with the provision that if Mr. Vandierstine has time he will prepare him for the Provincial Exhibition races. Mr. Vandierstine as many of our readers know, opened up a bakery on the corner of Weymouth and Burn Streets last fall and it has been very successful. His leave of absence having expired he is going back to his avocation in the railway shops where he has spent 30 years but will continue the bakery business as a "hobby."

One of the best trotters raced by Mr. Dodge was Periscope, that he gave a record of 2.10 1/4 as a two-year-old. At three she was almost unbeatable, winning the Kentucky Futurity and other stake events and lowering the world's record for a five heat race. She ended up with a record of 2.03 1/2. To name all of the great horses owned by Mr. Dodge would take space, but we will mention a few others such as Great Britton 2.02 1/4, Betty Taylor 2.03 1/4, Lady Wanateka, that raced so sensationally against Peter Volo 2.02 1/4, Hollywood 2.02 1/4, Hollywood Susan 2.02 1/4, Hollywood Portia 2.03, Hollywood Bob (3) 2.04 3/4.

S. Thane Belyea writing from Charlottetown, N. B., gives us a piece of horse news that is of real importance—the sale of Happy L. 2.06 3/4. Happy L. was a winner all along the way last season—twice at Charlottetown during Confederation and Exhibition weeks. At the last named meeting he won the 2.19 Trot and Pace in straight heats.

The best juvenile pacer in White's stable was Betty Heekin by Guy Abbey. She was in 2.22 with the last quarter in 31 seconds. The leading two-year-old in Tommy Berry's stable is Daycira by Guy Day. She trotted in 2.19 1/4, last quarter in 32 1/4. Wil Hughes, who only trains a horse or two, has a two-year-old in Lands-downe by Scotland, that was a mile in 2.20 3/4, last quarter in 31 1/4. You will notice that Walter Hall made no mistake when he purchased Scotland 1.59 1/2. His get has shown up brilliantly in early training.

The best performance by a two-year-old Pinehurst was Luther Hanover's mile in 2.16 1/2, last half in 1.07. He is a pacer. None of Pa-shall's two-year-old trotters have beaten 2.20.

Among the starters in the Hambletonian Stake next August at Goshen, New York, will be Remus (2) 2.13 1/2, a mammoth son of Pa-shall, owned by the wrestling promoter Paul Bowser, Billy Dickerson and Harry Short. He stands 17 1/2 hands high and weighs over 1,300 lbs. At last year's he had trotted the fastest mile over the Ohio State Fair grounds in training this season—2.28. In all our experience we have never seen a horse comparable in size to Remus race and it will be interesting to watch how he performs.

Allie Jane by Scotland 1.59 1/2 is one of the top two-year-olds trained in Florida this season. Her best mile was 2.16 with a quarter in 29 3/4 seconds—terrific speed for a youngster. His Excellency by Volomite 2.03 1/2, trotted in 2.16 1/4 with the last quarter in 32 seconds. Reverend by Scotland, was in 2.17 3/4 with the last quarter in 31 1/4 seconds. Jane Reynolds of Scotland was in 2.19 1/2 with the last quarter in 32, and Blitzen by Guy Abbey was in 2.18 1/2 with a quarter in 32.
