### Increase in Cargo Tonnage At Ports

OTTAWA, May 26—(CP)—Every Canadian harbor shared in an over-all 14 per cent increase in cargo tonnage handled last year, the annual report of the National Harbors Board showed today. The report was tabled in the Commons by Transport Minister Chevrier.

Cargo tonnage landed at Canadian harbors in 1947 totalled 31,183,000, a 3,991,000 ton increase over the previous year. During the year 42,876 vessels arrived in this country's ports. Total tonnage was 29,856,000, compared to 39,823 ships with a tonnage of 26,878,000 the previous year.
