PROVINCE OF NOVA SCOTIA

NOTICE

FISH BUYERS and OPERATORS of FISH PLANTS and CANNERIES in NOVA SCOTIA will please take notice that the Nova Scotia Fisheries Act has been proclaimed effective the 1st day of January, 1948.

The Act contains the following provisions: (1) Every person who operates a fish plant (or a cannery in which fish are canned) will require a FISH PLANT LICENSE. (2) Every person who buys or collects fish from fishermen otherwise than for his personal use or for sale only by him at retail will require a PURCHASER'S LICENSE. (3) The annual license fee for each plant or buyer is Two Dollars (\$2.00) payable in advance; (4) The penalty for purchasing fish or operating a fish plant or cannery without a license is One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00 per diem).

The expression "fish plant" means any plant or cannery in which fish are prepared for food and includes cold storage plants which handle fish, fish reduction plants and fish liver oil plants, but does not include an establishment used only by a fisherman to prepare or cure only his own catches of fish or an establishment in which fish are sold, only at retail.

The expression "fish" includes shellfish and crustaceans; also whales, seals, and other marine animals.

A fish buyer who purchases fish only in the capacity of a salaried agent of a licensed fish plant operator will be issued a license without charge if the fish plant operator applies for a license for him. All other fish buyers, including independent buyers, commission buyers, and buyers representing firms outside of Nova Scotia should apply direct to the address given below and will be required to pay the regular fee.

The holder of a Fish Plant License does not require a Purchaser's License to buy fish.

Selected Issues Show Improvement

MONTREAL, Dec. 11—(CP)—Selected issues showed modest improvement in mainly quiet dealings on the stock exchange and curb market today. Mines displayed gains ranging from 1/2 to 3/4 cents on a moderately active market.

Closing averages showed banks up 0.23 at 28.43; utilities up 0.1 at 74.9; industrials up 0.2 at 126.0, papers up 0.18 at 370.05; golds up 0.22 at 77.34. Approximate industrial volume amounted to 36,600 shares, 10,000 shares less than yesterday. Mining sales amounted to 120,400 shares, compared with 86,200 shares yesterday.

In metals, Aluminum jumped up 8 points at 230 and Noranda gained 2 3/4 at 49. Shawinigan was shaded at 21 7/8 in utilities and Shawinigan Preferred dropped 1-2 at 48. Bell was off 3-8 at 168 5/8. Papers were generally mixed. B. C. Pulp established a new high of 98 by gaining 2 1/2 points.

Seagram and Walker displayed gains of 1-2 point each in beverages. Their respective closing quotations were 20 5/8 and 26 1/2 in steel. Alcoma was off one point at 55, on a turnover of 1.1 million shares.

Royal was up 1-2 at 24 3/4 but Canadian National Bank dipped 1-4 at 21.

On a turnover of 15,000 shares. Consolidated Homestead went ahead 1-4 at 14 3/4 and Home gained 15 cents at 4.75. Caspe on a turnover of 23,000 shares lost 30 cents at 1.70.

Industrials were fractionally higher with the exception of the New Dominion Textile issue which lost 1-4 at 11 3/4.

In mines, Pato went ahead 20 cents at 5.30. On a turnover of 16,200 Bob's Lake held steady.

NEW YORK, Dec. 11—(AP)—Strong spots persisted in today's stock market although relatively light liquidation crippled many leaders.

The Associated Press 60-stock composite was unchanged at 63.4.

Canadian issues were up fractions. McIntyre gained 3/4 and Hiram Walker added 1-2. Dome Mines and Disasters Seagrams were both up 3-8. Canadian Pacific was unquoted.

On the curb, Lake Shore was unquoted and Giant Yellow Knife added 1-8.

American Telephone, a long-time laggard, was ex-dividend but climbed a point at 151. Ahead 1 to 2 points or so were International Caterpillar (ex-dividend) at 37, Pontiac, Allied Chemical 188 1-2, Owens-Illinois 71 1-2, Worthington Pump 58 5-8, Plymouth Oil 31 3/4 and Shell Oil 95 1-2.

Dividends again were pretty well ignored but Bliss and Laughlin and Container Corp. were up a shade on pleasing disbursements.

Warren Petroleum was off 1-4 at 48 1-2 and Douglas Aircraft 1-2 at 45 1-2.
