At the police court in this city yesterday the prohibition case against Henry Benoit for third offence was adjourned for one week on account of some of the witnesses not showing up.

Premier Hazard announced in the House during the debate of Supply that Dr. Anderson, City, Chief Superintendent of Education, had intimated his intention of resigning in the near future.

Capt. A. H. Borden will arrive in this city from Halifax on May 1st to examine the physical culture classes in the Prince of Wales College, also the lady teachers and Principal's classes. These have been conducted this winter by Drill Sergeant McKimney and Sergeant Wallace who speak very highly of the way the young ladies and gentlemen of the college have improved in this special course.

The last issue of the Canada Gazette contains the following notices of promotion: 82nd Abegweit Light Infantry Regiment.—To be provisionally Lieutenant: Sergeant Daniel McEwen vice W. H. Tidmarsh, transferred. 4th February, 1911. Captain A. J. B. Mellich is transferred to the "72nd Highlanders of Canada," 24th February, 1911. The name of Lieut. Alfred Robert Bruce Duck is as now described and not as stated in General Order No. 53 of 1902.

The Baptist Church was well filled last night, and the service particularly impressive. Hugh McLean of Calgary, a P. E. Islander by birth, opened the meeting with an inspiring song service. Mr. McLean is a well known evangelistic singer, not only possessing a fine voice, but using it with a skill which brings out the sentiments of the hymns which he sings. Though here on a business trip he has kindly consented to lead the song service in these meetings. Two solos sung by him last night were of a particularly high character. Mr. Calder preached on "The Two Houses," emphasizing the point that faith in God was the only safe foundation for permanent character. The meeting tonight will begin at 8 o'clock. Mr. McLean will sing and Mr. Calder will preach. None should miss these services as they are full of interest and power.

Tenders are being called for the construction of the Moncton concrete sidewalks, a city believing that they have hitherto been paying too much for the laying of permanent walks and being of the opinion that by calling for contracts they will secure sidewalks at a more moderate cost. A recent issue of the Moncton Times gives an extended reference to this question and quotes E. C. Donald of that city as an authority on the proper laying of cement concrete walks. Mr. Donald is well known in this city having contracted for and built the present Dominion Building, over twenty years ago. Speaking of the laying of cement walks Mr. Donald said: "A heavy foundation for sidewalks, even in clay soils, is unnecessary and only a needless expense and that where a foundation is not laid below the frost, the only object is to break the connection between the clay and the concrete and that for this purpose three or four inches is as good as eight or ten inches more. He said coal cinders were regarded quite as good as gravel or broken stone for the necessary foundation. The material used depends upon which is the most abundant and the cheapest. An examination of private residential concrete walks laid last year by Mr. Donald shows that they have stood the strain of a very severe winter just as well as the city walk. As these private walks were laid at a cost of 15 cents a square foot, it would seem that the city should be able to get a good, serviceable walk laid at this price.

The N. B. and P. E. I. Methodist conference will be held in Centenary Church, St. John, beginning on June 5th, next. At yesterday morning's meeting of the Methodist ministers, arrangements were discussed for the entertainment and the program during the visitors' stay. The pulpits of the local churches on that date will be supplied by outside clergymen.—St. John Telegraph.

Cyclone Burns, the crack Boston wrestler, who wrestled in this city, lost a match with Bob Berry, the English middleweight, champion, at the Columbia Theatre, Boston, recently because he was too generous in agreeing to throw the latter twice in an hour after the Englishman had pulled out a finish match on account of the Cyclone's extra weight. Next week Peter Getz, another English crack will go against Sam Anderson, in a finish match.

St. Joseph's Convent is undergoing some improvements. The old St. Andrew's Hall which was brought down Hillsboro' river from St. Andrew's in March, 1864, had been placed on Pownal Street, where foundations were prepared for it. For a number of years past these foundations have been rotting and the floor of the chapel has sunk 4 1/2 inches. A new foundation is being laid down now and all the walls have been replastered. The chapel will be painted throughout and a hardwood floor laid down. On the top flat, which was formerly a garret, six bedrooms and toilet room have been provided. This will give much better accommodation for the boarders. This convent has progressed very satisfactorily in the last few years. This year here is a school of 275 children including a class of 32 boys. Special mention might be made of a boat which may be seen in this convent. It is a small craft being only about 12 feet long but it is over one hundred years old and was built by the late Bishop McEachern for travelling purposes. In this he journeyed over the whole Island, in the summer putting it on wheels and in the winter on runners. This curio is highly prized by the Sisters of St. Joseph's.



WOULD BREAK DISTANCE RECORD WITH MULE

OKLAHOMA CITY, Okla., April 17 Robert W. Brennan, who has a reputation as a broncho buster, will attempt to establish a new endurance record for a mule, when leaving Oklahoma City on April 25, he will ride to New York city, seeking to cover the distance in 25 days. An Oklahoma mule has been secured.

The route of the trip is by way of St. Louis to Chicago, and then east to Cleveland, Pittsburgh, Philadelphia and into New York. Typically western in his way, he entertains a lofty contempt for the modern stage hero dressed in chaps, sombrero, gauntlets and a six shooter.

He states that no effort has before been made to establish an endurance record with a mule. He participated in a number of broncho endurance tests in Wyoming and Colorado, but all of them for short distances.
