Henry Lewis Dethroned By Commission

NEW YORK, July 27—(AP)—Important 8-10s affecting three of the eight boxing divisions were taken today by the New York State Athletic Commission. 1. The light-heavyweight title held by John Henry Lewis was declared vacant in New York State. 2. The commission declined to accept Al "Hotshot" Rosen, last night's contender of Freddie Steele, as the new middle-weight champion of the world. 3. A 15-round elimination bout between small champions of San Francisco and the Japanese-born Katsuma Morioka was suggested as the opening step in a campaign to produce an undisputed fly-weight champion.

The action against Lewis came as no surprise. The news was "set down" because of his consistent refusal to accept a challenge for a title bout filed Feb. 10 by "Tiger Jack" Fox of Spokane, Wash.

How to Make Bordeaux Mixture

The late blight disease and rot of potatoes can be almost perfectly controlled by keeping the vines covered with a thin coating of Bordeaux mixture. The mixture recommended is known as 4-4-40 Bordeaux, and consists of 4 lbs. of Bluestone (copper sulphate) and 4 pounds of stone lime in 40 gallons of water. It must be made up fresh each time it is used. On the other hand, the bluestone and the lime may be kept dissolved in water for an indefinite period. This is known as "stock solution" and is recommended for its convenience.

To spray an acre 5 times requires 40 pounds of bluestone and 40 pounds of lime. Eighty gallons is the amount recommended for each application per acre. Less than that amount is not sufficient to thoroughly cover a good growth of vines.

Stock Solution of Copper Sulphate

Take a 40-gallon barrel or a pail, fill it up with water. Put 40 pounds of copper sulphate in a burlap bag and then suspend it just beneath the surface of the water (not on the bottom) until it has dissolved. This will be one pound of bluestone in each gallon of water.

Stock Solution of Lime

In another 40-gallon barrel place 40 pounds of good stone lime. Add 20 gallons of water and add a small quantity of water, allowing it to bubble well before adding more water. After the lime has dissolved, add 40 pounds of bluestone, and pour the water into a bucket. Add 40 pounds of the same stock solution through a coarse sack. You then have a stock solution of 4-4-40 Bordeaux.

CAUTION—NEVER MIX THE TWO STOCK SOLUTIONS TOGETHER BEFORE DILUTING. ALWAYS MIX WITH MOST OF THE WATER WHICH GOES INTO THE TANK.

For an 80-gallon spray tank simply add 40 gallons of water to the stock solution. If you find more convenient it is possible to dissolve 80 pounds of bluestone in a 40-gallon barrel, or 80 pounds of lime solution, and add 40 gallons of water. The difference is that you then have 2 pounds represented in each gallon instead of one.

It may be noted that hand machines do not produce as good pressure as the power machines. Neither do they apply so much pressure to any given square inch of hand machine it is necessary to spray twice, going over the field in opposite directions at each spraying. Spraying with a hand machine until the tops are mature, September is the critical month for blight. Power machines should carry a pressure of 100 to 120 pounds. The more pressure the better the job, and the less blight on the vines.
