(Continued from page 1) He pointed out that despite the inevitable confusion of the withdrawal, the removal of large numbers of British and French troops still goes on with the Germans helpless to stop it... Although rescue of the bottled up Allied army remained Britain's greatest concern, informed London observers said they looked for an early attempt by Hitler to invade England and France with sea and air power, which would be rejected immediately... The nation steeled itself for the expected casualty list from Flanders... Bitter Fighting... "Bloody, bitter fighting all the way," one soldier called it. "It came home on one of the seven ships which reached the same port within two hours today... The men carried all the equipment they could salvage. We left the heavy stuff behind and destroyed it," one said... The bombing at Dunkerque, an officer declared, is "terrific, but 'the loss of life small'... In a broadcast tonight, Arthur Greenwood, minister without portfolio, declared Hitler is sitting on granite. He continued: "Our power in the field, on the sea and in the air waxes as his wanes. Our economic resources expand as his are eaten up... 'We have suffered grievous losses. We have inflicted greater losses on the enemy. There is no need to be downhearted.'... Reliable sources said about two-thirds of the 90,000 troops returned to England up to this morning are British, of which there were originally 175,000 in Flanders. The other troops brought here are Belgian and French. It was believed tonight the total had been raised to 100,000 brought back... The "fifth column" drive was pushed with ever greater intensity because of the revelations by returning officers about the spy infiltration in North France and Belgium... "It seemed," declared one, "that if army headquarters moved into a house—even one of a row—it could be guaranteed that the house would be bombed... While England welcomed its Flanders heroes it became generally known that with the withdrawal of northern troops, more and more British expeditionary force soldiers are going into action below the Somme River where the great Allied stand is shaping up... The Admiralty announced today loss of its first cruiser to German air attack. The Curlew, fitted as an anti-aircraft cruiser, was sunk some days ago off the North coast of Norway. It was announced, four officers and five men of the crew, estimated 400 men aboard were lost. One cruiser has been lost previously, the Effingham which ran on an uncharted Norwegian rock.
