**WORKING ON STREETS.**—Work on the streets which will be paved with asphalt this summer, has for the last week or two, been steadily advancing under the direction of Mr. J. P. Up to the present a great deal of the work has consisted in laying storm sewers along a small portion of Longworth Ave., and along the entire length of Pleasant street, the latter system being necessary for the provision of adequate drainage.
