### FOREIGN TENDER LOWER

The Paris Co's Tender Lower Than the  
Royal Electric Co. of Montreal

OTTAWA, Dec. 6.—Lord Strathcona  
has cabled the authorities here in charge  
of the Canadian exhibit at the Paris  
exposition that the contract for supply-  
ing the electric plant and light in the  
colonial buildings has been awarded to  
a Paris firm. It was hoped that a  
Canadian firm would obtain the con-  
tract, and the tenders of the Paris com-  
panies having the the advantage of  
being on the spot were much lower,  
the one obtaining it being \$3000 lower  
than that submitted by the Royal Elec-  
tric Company of Montreal.
