Rooney-Garland Combine Scores Again In "Babes On Broadway"

Hollywood's finest juvenile talent headed by Mickey Rooney and Judy Garland, arrived at the Capitol Theatre yesterday, in the new M-G-M Musical, "Babes on Broadway," and the result is something to shout about.

Both Rooney and Miss Garland have shown their song-and-dance talent in such musical pictures as "Babes in Arms" and "Strike Up the Band," but apparently they were only warming up in these earlier productions. For in this new one they really go to town, not only singing and dancing to the hilt but delivering a series of impersonations of famous theatre people the like of which has never been seen before on either stage or screen.

Among them are Rooney's brilliant take-off of the fiery Carmen Miranda, done to a number called "Bombshell from Brazil," his impersonations of Harry Lauder and Richard Mansfield, and Judy's impersonations of Sarah Bernhardt, Blanche Ring, singing "Rings On My Fingers, Bells On My Toes," and "Mary Is Grand Old Name," as made famous by Fay Templeton. There are a flock of other songs, new and old, and too numerous to mention.

The youthful stars have able support in this story of the youngsters who invade New York annually to seek fame and success on the stage and, after a long struggle, finally find their names in lights on the Great White Way. Fay Bainter gives a persuasive portrayal of the sympathetic secretary of a hardboiled producer, Little Virginia Weider, in her first musical role, proves herself a singer and dancer as well as an actress.
